







They are proud to support Diversity, Equity and Inclusion work.
- 2- NATE HOWDER is a senior entomology major and president of Bug Club MSU, which they've helped grow from less than 10 to 300+ members. As an MSU Bug House volunteer, they create a welcoming, supportive environment for arthropod enthusiasts and work to change public perceptions of bugs to help combat the ongoing collapse of insect biodiversity.
- 3- DANNY CABALLERO is leading an effort to revolutionize how physics is taught at the college level. The associate professor helped create a student-first learning model that is attracting international attention while improving STEM courses for students at MSU.
- 4- RIYA PATEL is a senior majoring in supply chain management and an active member of the business fraternity Phi Chi Theta. She is also the marketing director at VIM Magazine, MSU's only student-run fashion, beauty and lifestyle publication. She was proud to help launch the VIM Collective, a name rebrand that created a sense of inclusion and community.
- 5- GEMMA REGUERA is an MSU microbiologist and professor. She and her team are known for discovering superpowers of microbes — from their ability to clean up nuclear waste to their instrumental role in harnessing energy from wastes and in biofuel production.
- 6- GERI ALUMIT ZELDES creates Emmy-winning social justice documentaries, involving MSU students throughout the process so they can develop storytelling and investigative reporting skills. The journalism professor was named among the "100 Most Influential Filipina Women in the World."

- 7- FLORENE MCGLOTHIAN-TAYLOR has been a veteran of the police force for 30+ years. She works to create an inclusive culture on campus in her role leading the MSU Police Department's Inclusion and Anti-Bias Unit, which proactively addresses police and community-related issues associated with bias.
- **8– PIOTR PASIK** is an instructor in MSU's department of kinesiology, teaching Wheelchair Sports. After obtaining three degrees from MSU, he traveled the world for his studies in the rehabilitation counseling program, exploring other cultures' perceptions of disabilities.
- 9- CHRISTIAN DURFIELD is a sophomore with a major in applied engineering sciences. He is involved in the National Society of Black Engineers (NSBE). One of his proudest moments as a Spartan was getting his first internship as a first-year student at the NSBE national conference. He aims to inspire the youth in his community by promoting education and equal opportunities, and by encouraging kindness in everyday interactions.
- 10-ADITI KULKARNI is a senior studying comparative cultures and politics in James Madison College with minors in Spanish, economics and international development. She co-founded the Spartan Food Security Council (SFSC), one of MSU's first student organizations fighting college student hunger. As a Spartan, she helped introduce the Hunger-Free Campus Bill in the Michigan House of Representatives.
- 11- ALONYA JACKSON is a senior kinesiology major in the Honors College, who is involved in Collegiate Midnight Golf and the Big Sister Little Sister Mentoring Program. As a Spartan, she is most proud of leaving her comfort zone to accept numerous opportunities presented to her at MSU. She hopes to be a changemaker in her community and start a nonprofit organization.


ALYSSA SPACE, '16



HOW TO APPLY

The application for admission will open in August for fall 2025 applicants. MSU strongly encourages students to take a college preparatory curriculum in high school. Students are also advised to apply early.

- 1. Applications for admission are available at admissions.msu.edu/apply as well as through the Common or Coalition application. MSU has no preference for one type of application over another, but it's important that you submit only one per admissions cycle.
- 2. Have your official transcripts sent to MSU.
- 3. ACT/SAT optional: Students will indicate on the application whether they would like SAT or ACT exam scores included in their evaluation. MSU's ACT code is 2032: the SAT code is 1465.
